Student Council


It is the object of the administration and the student body to seek out and initiate the ideal in student government in whichever system is most satisfactory to the condition of the school at the time.

All homecoming activities are among the many sponsored by the Council.



All in all everyone seemed to agree "It was a wonderful night."




