Winning the game from our ancient rival, Caro, was a delightful climax.



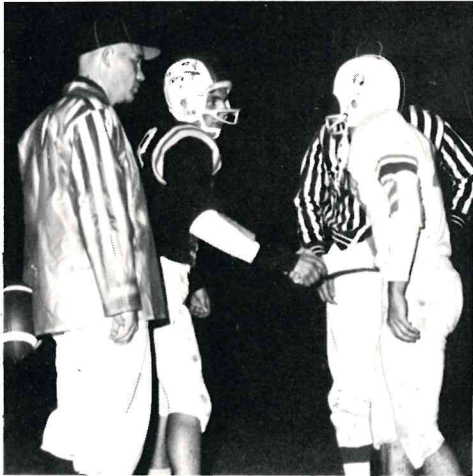

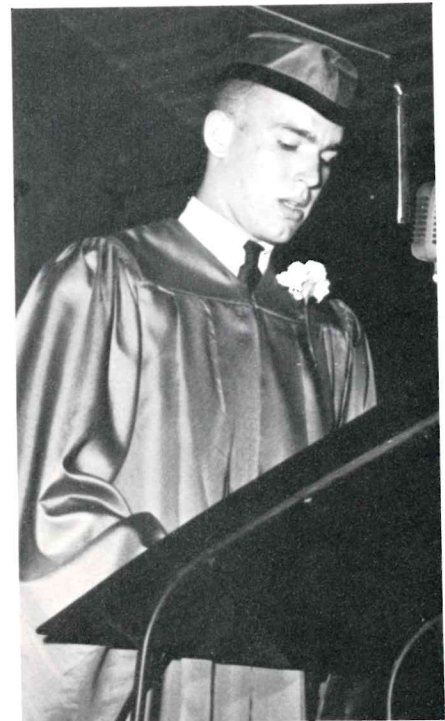

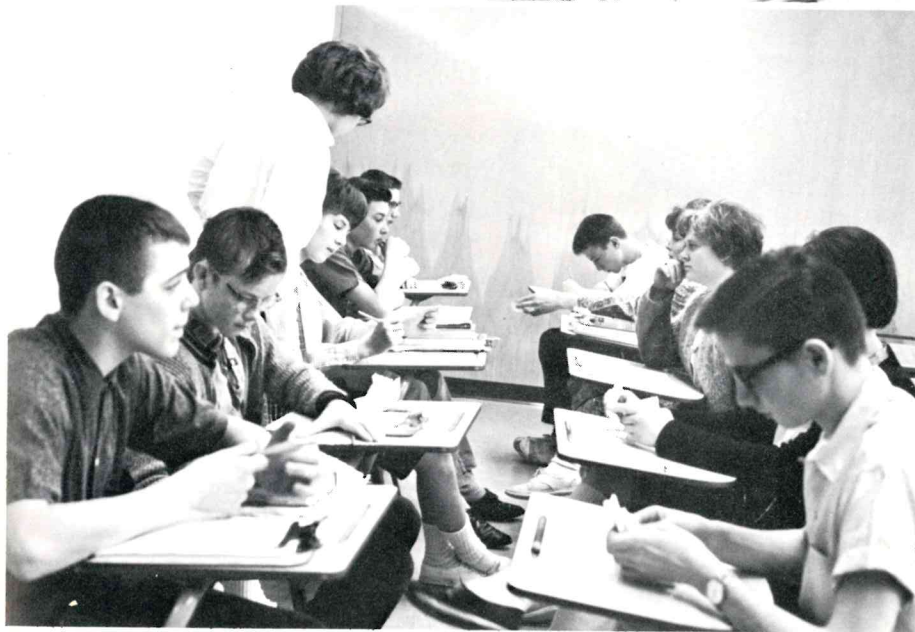

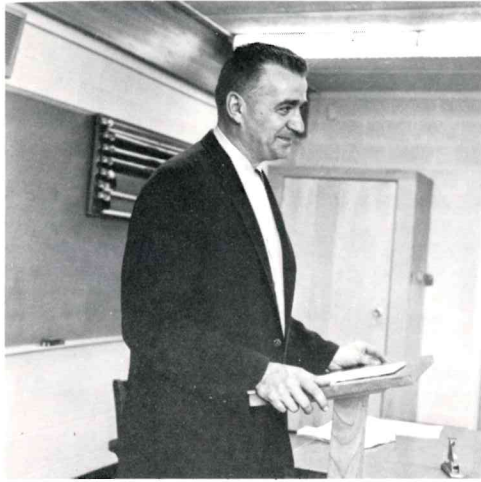

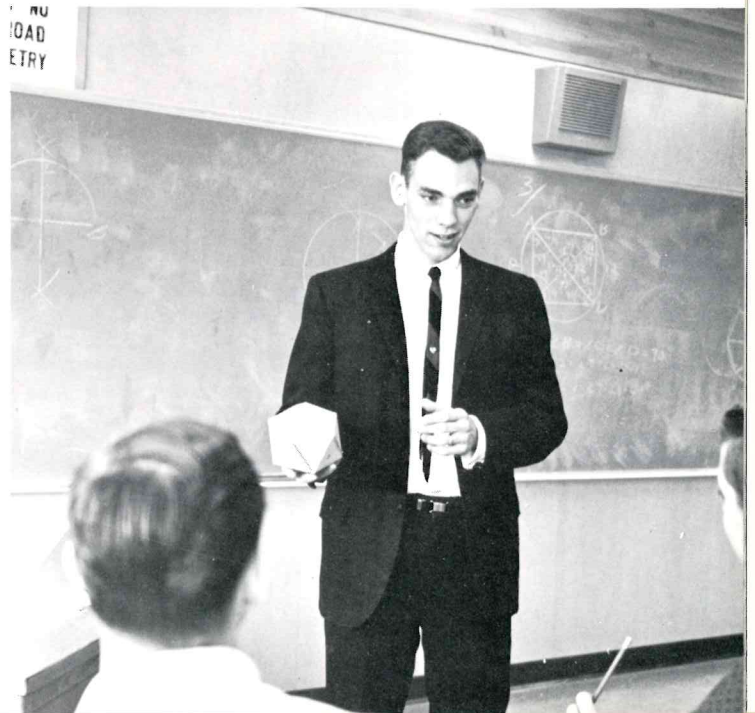

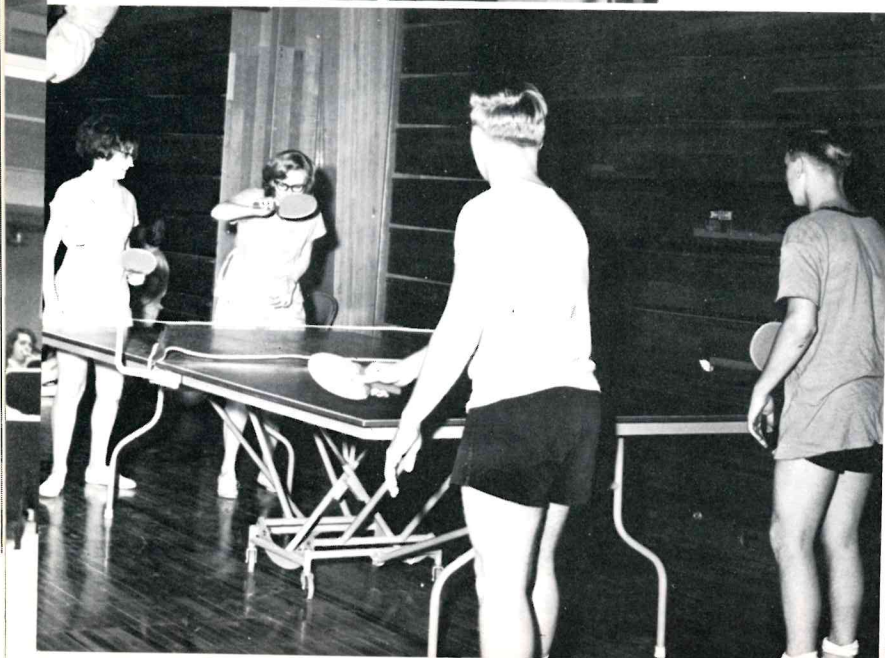

Two Vassar players, Rob Johnson and Milo Earls, were chosen for the All Conference first team, and George Miller received honorable mention, All Conference.

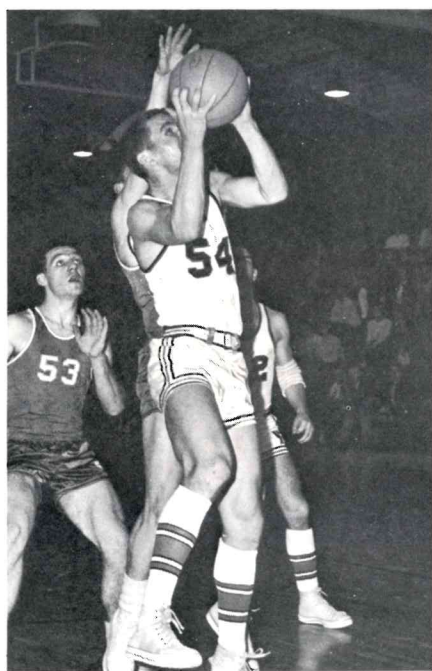
