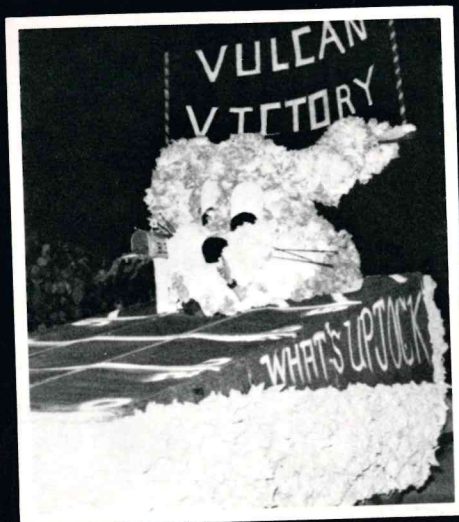
Homecoming '75
