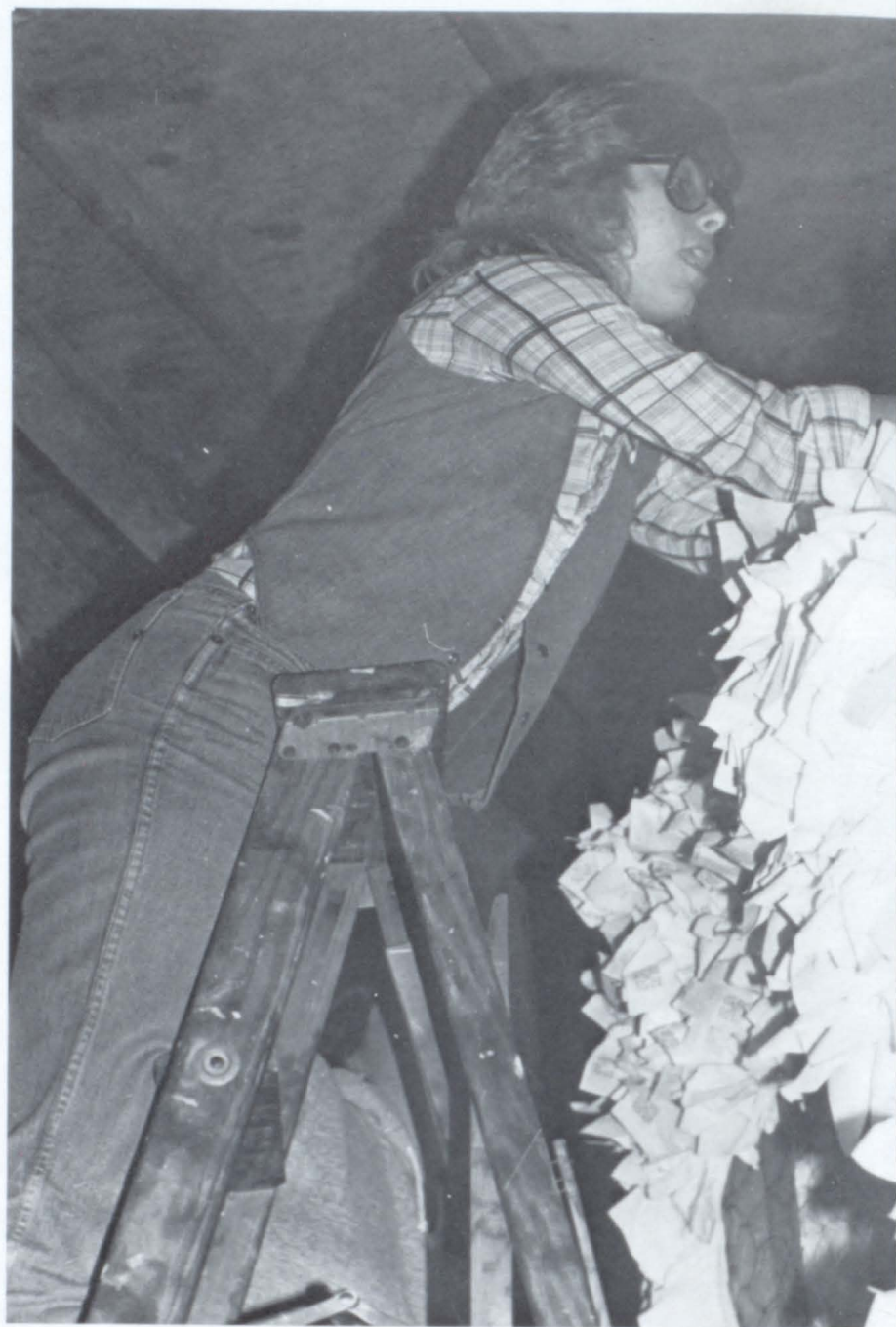
IT ALL BEGAN ON PAPER

ODE TO THE SEVENTIES

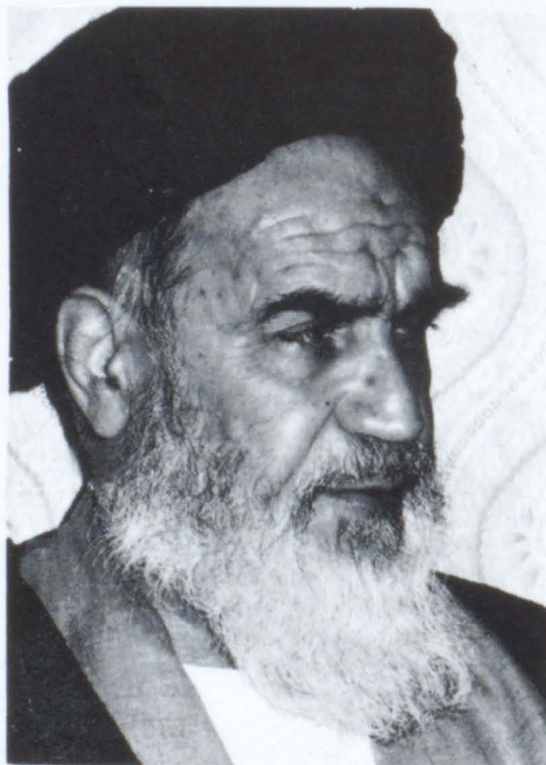

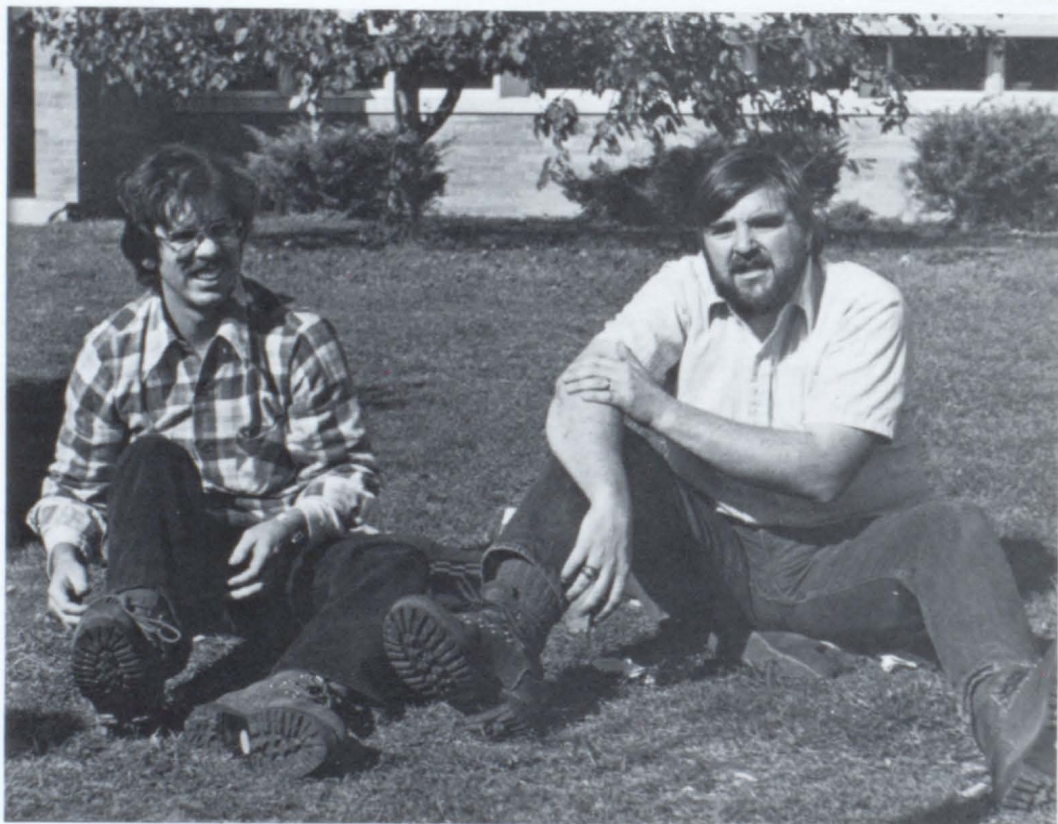

Striking Teachers Change Year

THE STUDENTS AT VHS HAD AN EARLY VACATION WHEN THE TEACHERS WENT ON STRIKE OCTOBER 11. 1980 SEEMED TO BE THE YEAR FOR TEACHER STRIKES, AS EDUCATORS ACROSS THE STATE STRIKED FOR HIGHER PAY, SMALLER CLASS SIZES, AND BETTER EDUCATION FOR THEIR STUDENTS.

VASSAR TEACHERS WERE ON STRIKE FOR THREE WEEKS. DURING THIS TIME, STUDENTS AND PARENTS WAITED FOR THE OUTCOME. THE WEATHER WAS NICE AND EVERYONE ENJOYED THEMSELVES; HOWEVER, DUE TO THE WALKING TEACHERS, THE SCHOOL CALENDAR HAD TO BE CHANGED.

SENIORS HAD A SAY IN THE OUTCOME, DURING A MEETING CONDUCTED BY THE TEACHERS ASSOCIATION. THEIR SCHEDULE WAS NOT CHANGED.

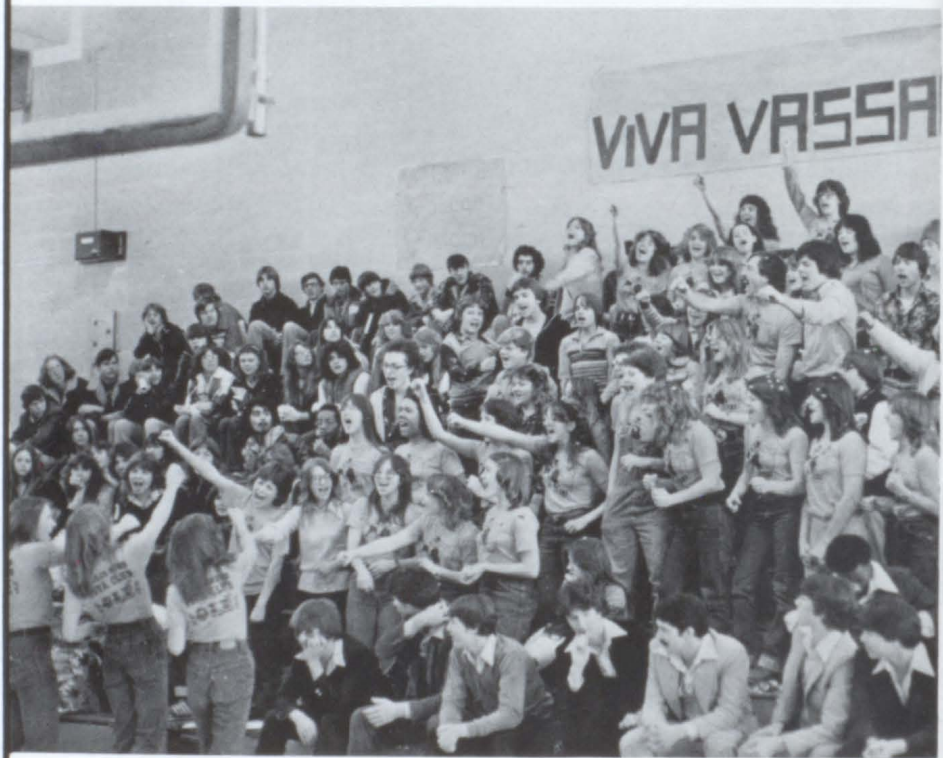
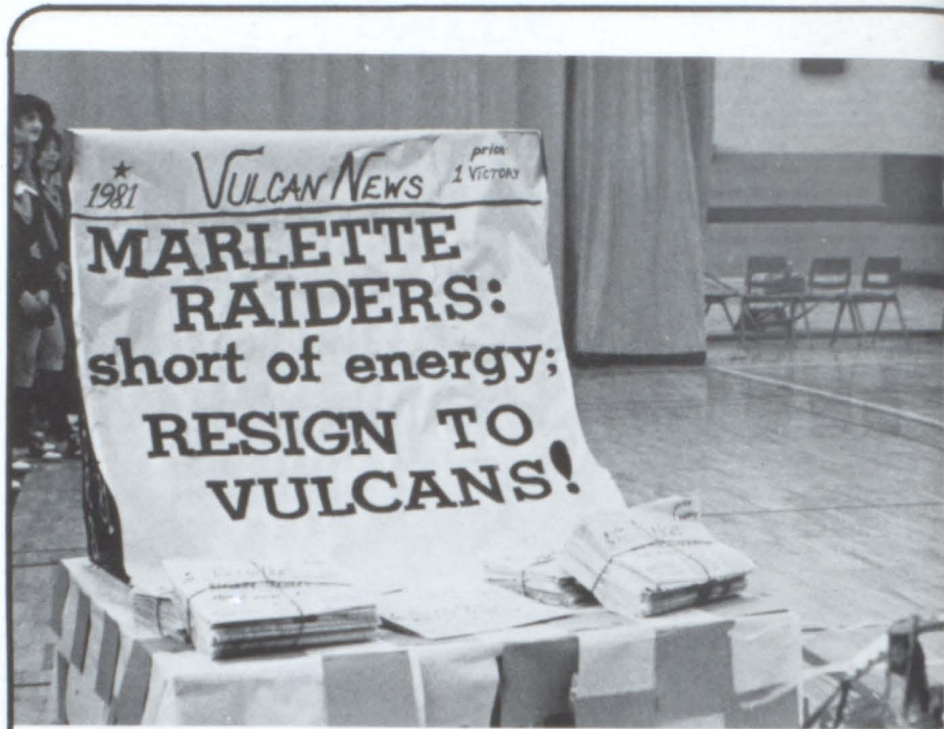


Comehoming

Comehoming is the way to bring spirit back to the student body as the basketball season ends.

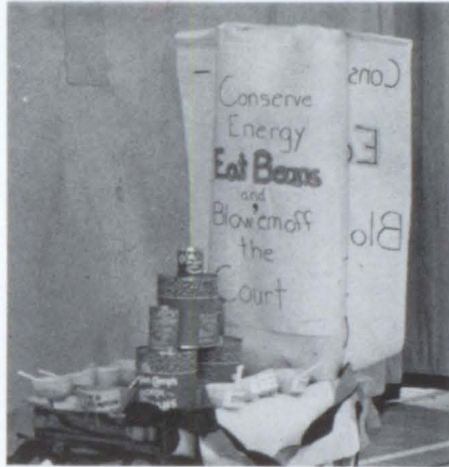

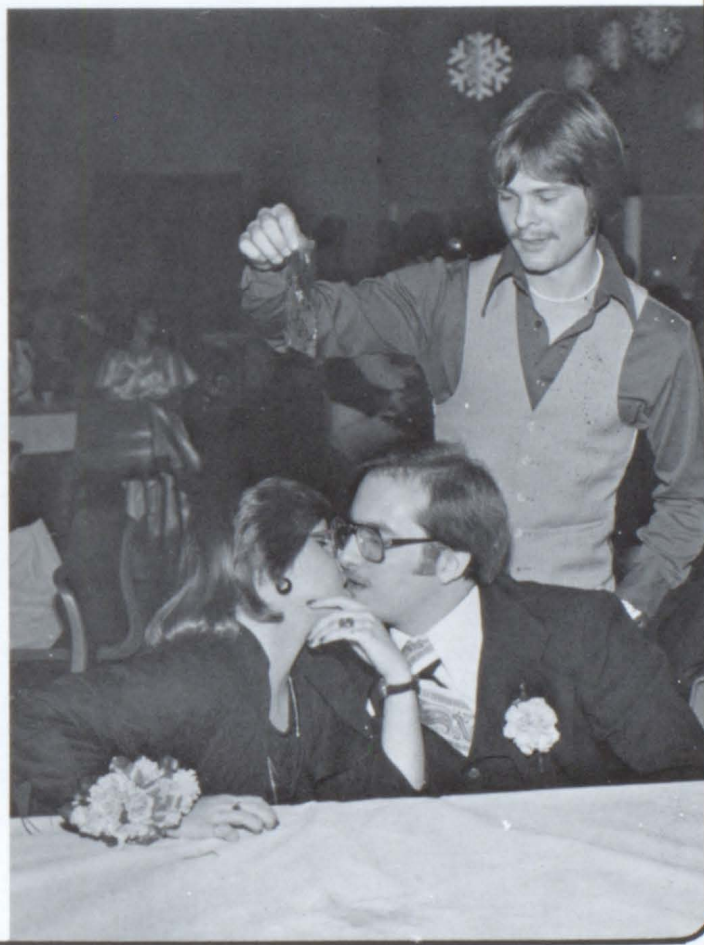

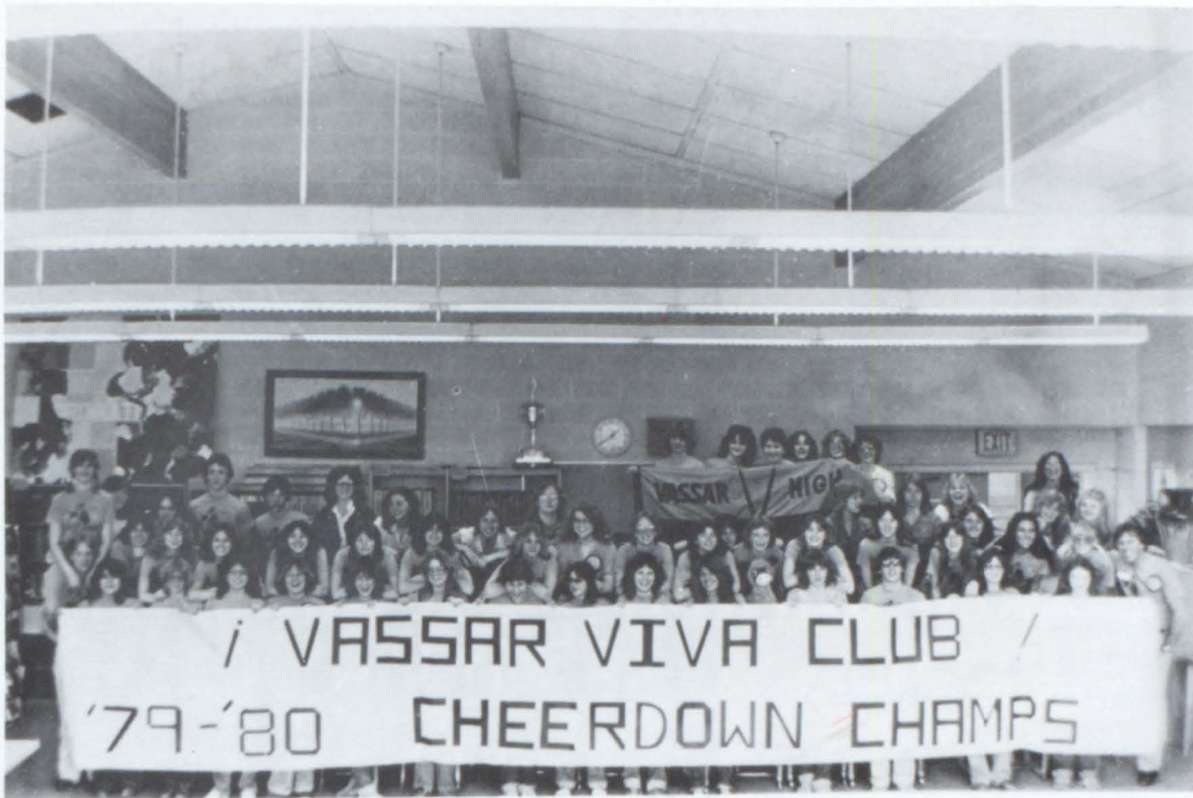

Once the teachers vote, all three categories are averaged together and these must meet the grade point average also.

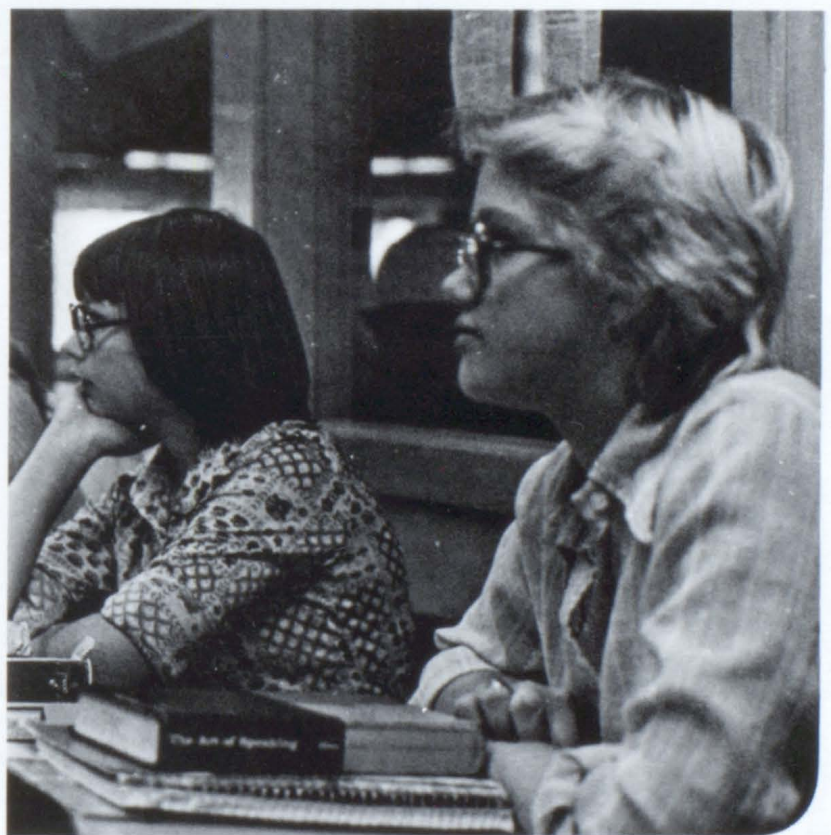
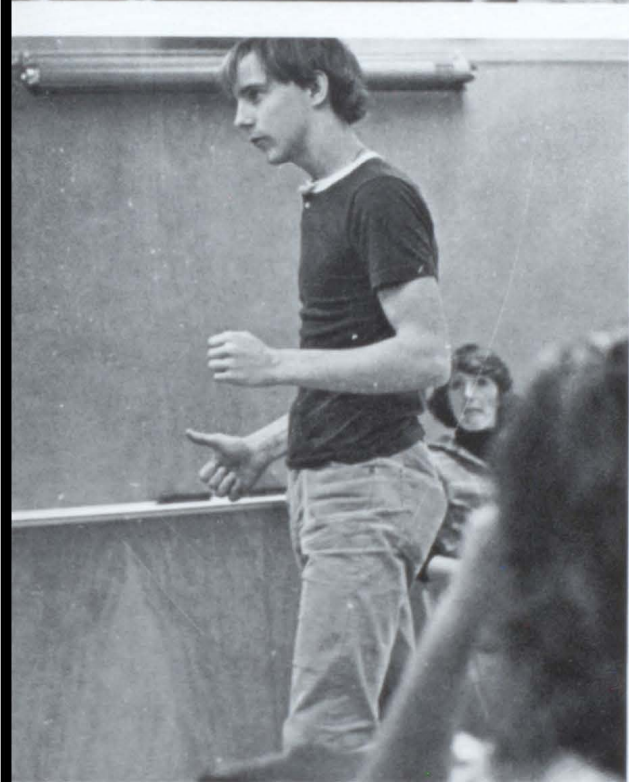
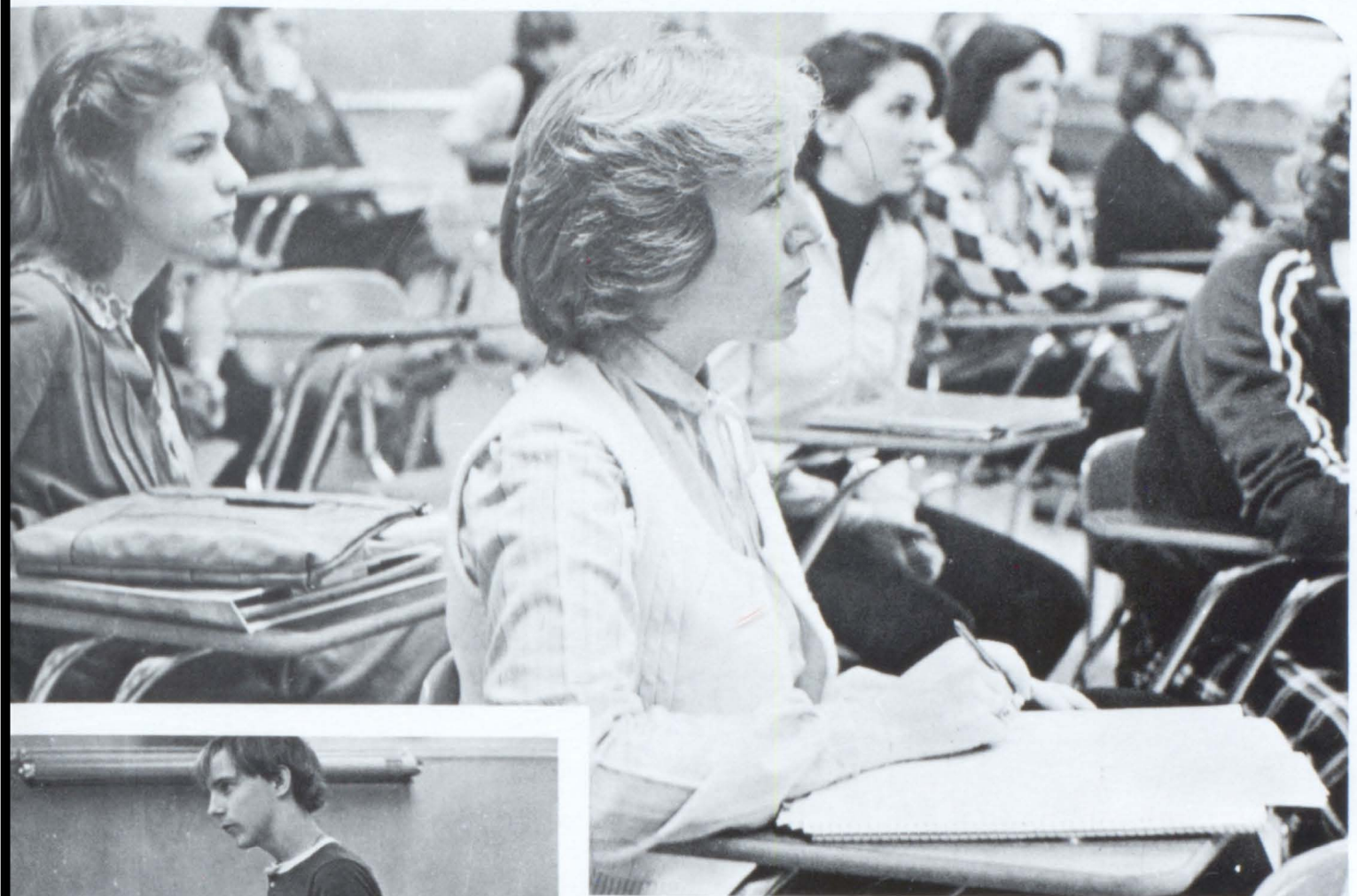

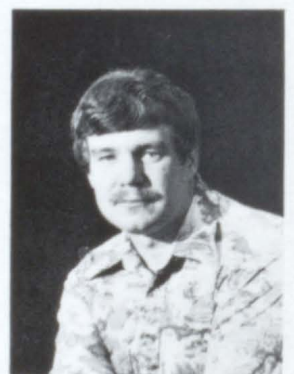
In a world of increasing technological advancement, Vassar students have the opportunity to sharpen their mathematical and scientific skills throughout their four years.

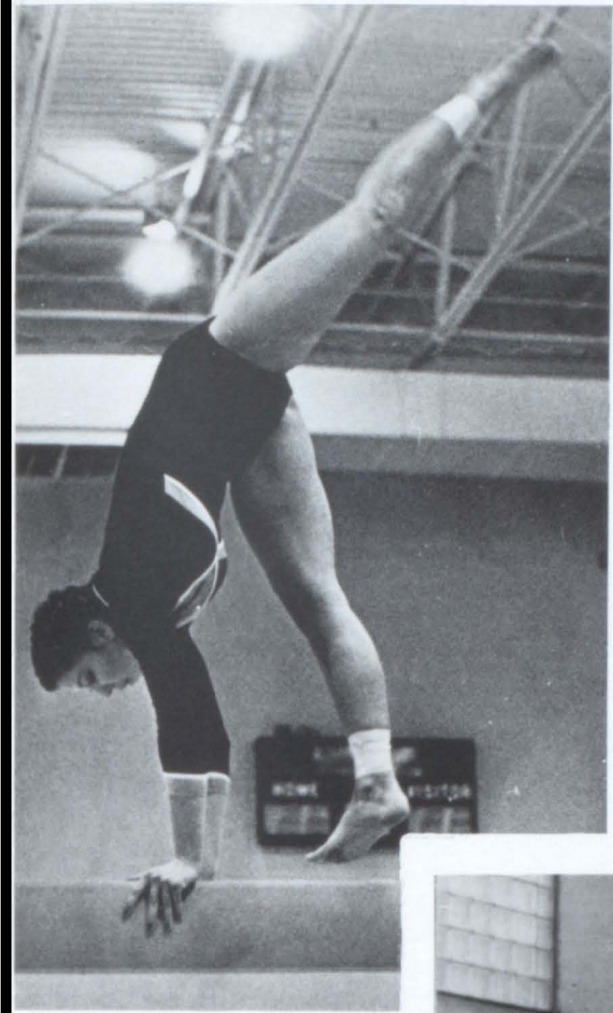
