

The odds were against the proposed renewal of 13 mills and an additional 8. On March 4, 1985, the proposed millage was defeated by 141 votes. The second vote held on June 10 was defeated by 263 votes.

A third vote was scheduled for August 26. This time the school dropped 3 mills asking only for renewal of 13 and an additional 5. Local news broadcasts and other media were full of updates and opinions about the proposed millage. Many people interviewed said they felt the increase was way out of line. The future of Vassar High school was beginning to look dim.

The suspense was great on Monday, August 26, as a record number of citizens marked the ballots that meant the difference between success and failure. The weather was pouring rain, but many students stood outside and held signs to encourage voters to give

them another year at Vassar Schools.

As we all know, the millage passed by over 300 votes. All threats of the splitting up of our school were zone. The school's sports and curriculum were safe and another year began. Many thanks are in order to he many people who worked to pass this millage.




The play deals with how we don't appreciate life as we live it. After it's too late, we understand its value.













Space Shuttle Challenger **Explodes**

Space Shuttle Challenger was 72 seconds into its 10th mission from Cape Canaveral on Wednesday, January 29, when a brilliant ball of incandescent flame erupted in the clear blue morning sky. The \$1.1 billion shuttle exploded over the Atlantic Ocean leaving no trace at that time of its seven crew members. It was the 25th shuttle flight ever.


It was a national tragedy unequalled since the assassination of John F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King. Newspaper and TV reporters reviewed the tragic explosion throughout the afternoon and the following week. President Reagan postponed his state of the union message, telling the nation in a brief statement that "this is the day for mourning and remembering" the crew of Challenger. The cause of the explosion was uncertain, although it is believed to have been caused by faulty solid rocket boosters.


Challenger crew members were Francis "Dick" Scobee, Michael Smith, Judith Resnick, Ellison Onizuka, Ronald McNair, Gregory Jarvis, and

Christa McAuliffe, the celebrated New Hampshire social studies teacher chosen to be the first ordinary citizen in space.

For those of us who watched the launch and saw the re-runs of the accident, it was a moment of growing up. Like our parents with the Kennedy assassination, it changed our lives forever.










Golf Team



On the evenings of March 20, 21, and 22, Vassar residents were entertained as well as amused as the Vassar High Thespians presented "Fiddle On The Roof".


"Fiddler" was about a small Jewish town in Anatevka where the rules of tradition were being changed.


No longer did a couple need a matchmaker to get married; no longer would the czar leave the Jewish people in peace; no longer would the village stay as it was.






