

Superintendent Retires



Mr. Teller shared an extra special year with the seniors, as this was also his last at Vassar High School. He announced in January of 1987 that he would be retiring as the superintendent of Vassar Public Schools.

Mr. Teller has been in the teaching profession for 36 years, the last 13 of them were spent at Vassar. He holds a bachelors, a masters, and a specialist degree from Eastern Michigan University. He began his teaching career as a junior high and elementary teacher at Utica. He later became the elementary principal and then moved on to junior high assistant principal. Mr. Teller began his move towards becoming a superintendent at the East China School District where he was in charge of curriculum and certified personnel. He then moved to Vassar Public Schools as superintendent.

"Working here has not always been easy," stated Mr. Teller, "but the people of the community support the school. The school is a place for a good, sound education, and I hope that people of the Vassar school district will continue to support the school."

When asked about his most positive experience at VHS, Mr. Teller commented, "This may not sound very positive, but it is when the first millage had been defeated. Just two weeks after I had first started as superintendent at VHS, I had to go before the board with ideas on where cuts had to be made. Needless to say, things did not start off on the right foot. Since then some of the same people have been my best supporters. I learned that night if things were going to work out for the best, we had to work together and we have."

Mr. Teller plans on taking a month off once he retires so he can get settled in his new home. After he has adjusted to his new life, he is going to either begin work at a school supply company or a financial institution. "Whatever I do I'm going to make sure that I have more spare time. I congratulate the seniors and wish them the best of luck in all their future endeavors."

Thursday, September 11, 1986, is a day no one in Vassar will ever forget. Many residents of low-lying areas woke up to water in their basements and/or yards. The downtown businesses were also affected. Rains that began late Tuesday night continued through most of Thursday.

The small tributaries kept emptying into the already swollen Cass River and by Saturday morning Vassar was experiencing the greatest flood disaster in its history. The raging river had not crested and was already 9 feet above flood stage. When it finally did crest on Saturday afternoon, it had reached a height of around 25 feet with a flood stage of 14 feet. By Monday the water was out of all the homes and off most roads. The damage could now be seen. Places where the road had caved in were in view and residents of the homes along the Cass were allowed into their homes to see the damage.

Damage in the Vassar area is expected to run around 50 million dollars. Some of the downtown businesses did not return as a result of the losses.

The only positive aspect of the experience was the way in which it pulled the town together. People who lived in homes which were not affected were out in the terrible weather assisting anyone who needed help. Many students were also involved in the cleanup.

One of the consequences of the flood is the relocation of many residents along the Cass River. At the present time, several groups are looking into the prospect of constructing two mini-malls to house the businesses wishing to relocate. The next ten years will be a period of change for Vassar, but one thing is for certain, Vassar will never be the same again.

The Mighty Cass



In the photo above, the flood waters were just beginning to rise. Since it had happened before, no one was too worried. By the time it was over, however, residents in the Heritage Valley Inn had been evacuated, Dancer's windows were gone and whatever couldn't be saved was floating down the river, as was the case for many other businesses. The flood was not without its ironies, though.

Tables in the Heritage Valley Inn were sent floating to the ceiling as the waters rose. When they receded and the tables returned to "earth", some were still set with napkins, dishes, and tableware undisturbed.

Four youths in the photo to the right row through the middle of town to catch a glimpse of the flooded businesses. Rowboats and, later on, motorboats were used to shuttle people from one side of town to the other because there was no other way to get across.

Only certain vehicles could or dared venture through in the early flood stages. Before it was over, Vassar was declared a disaster area and the National Guard was called in to control the situation. Those businesses still in operation, plus all the churches and civic groups in town, banded together to feed, clothed and shelter those in need.

Many of our students pitched in when the clean-up began. Without a doubt, the Flood of '86 will long be remembered.





































Mr. Davis Retires After 28 Years In Education



After 28 years of teaching in the Michigan Public School system, Mr. Jim Davis has decided to retire. Mr. Davis, a science teacher, taught his first seven years in Springport, Michigan, and the remaining 21 years at Vassar High School.

"Coming to Vassar was almost accidental," he noted. "I received an application for Vassar from an administrator who had moved from Springport to Vassar. I filled it out, as I had nothing to lose. So here I am!" Mr. Davis was happy to move to Vassar because it was a bigger school system with more opportunity.

He feels there have been many accomplishments in his teaching career, but he listed getting the National Honor Society back on track and moving in the right direction as his greatest one.

While acknowledging that there have been some up years and down years in his career, he said the bad aspects are so few and minor that they are overpowered by the many good things about teaching at Vassar.

Two honors that Mr. Davis has received over the years are Teacher of the Year in 1969 and <u>The Advertiser</u> Coach of the Year when he coached the Girls' Basketball team.

Mr. Davis commented that his greatest honor is seeing students of his go on in life and obtain their goals they have worked hard for.
