







The Vassar Varsity football team won their first game in two years to the dismay of the Garber Dukes, 20-19. After the final seconds ticked off the clock, Vassar fans rushed out onto their home field to congratulate the players.

Garber scored a touchdown in the first quarter to take a 6-0 lead, and then drove to the Vassar six yard line but lost the ball on downs. On the very next play Vassar quarterback Brandon Hornung threw a 94 yard touchdown strike to Tom Eaton. Eaton kicked the extra point to give Vassar a 7-6 advantage.

Garber scored another touchdown before the end of the half to take a 12-7 lead into the ockerroom at halftime.

Both teams came out fired up in the second half, as Garber scored their third touchdown of the game and made the extra-point kick to take a 19-7 lead. Vassar countered on a Stephen Bobowski 19-yard touchdown run, with Eaton converting the extra point kick, which erased seven more points from the deficit, 19-14.

Going into the fourth quarter the score remained the same, until Bobowski finished an 11-play drive with a one yard touchdown plunge. Josh Taylor, with an interception with ust over one minute remaining, sealed the win for the Vulcans.

The Russian team attends a specialized volleyball school in Moscow. Although the girls range in age form 14-16, their height and physical ability promise aspiring volleyball careers.


Sparta's head coach, Leonid Berezin, visited VHS early last year. During his stay, he assisted Coach Ramer and her team with volleyball drills and techniques.




SENIOR CLASS OFFICERS

Varsity Football Strikes Back








The Vulcans picked up their biggest win of the season on Feb.7 when they destroyed the Frankenmuth Eagles 67-52.

WRESTLING TEAM MAKES VASSAR HISTORY








WAY TO GO DAVE
