
Shannon Accepted to West Point






Fall Takes First in State

Dustin Garner Shannon Beth A. Simpson Craig Smith Blossom Travels To Guatemala

From January 17th through the 28th, 1996, Senior Laura Blossom traveled to Guatemala for a missionary trip with her church. She went with a construction group and worked on a house belonging to a missionary from her church. Laura was influenced by her father and brother who had been on missionary trip in previous years.

Before her departure from the states, Laura and her father had to get vaccinations for polio and other diseases. Blossom stated, "The most difficult thing we had to do was get our passports, and with our government being shut down at the time, it was very difficult."

Although Blossom was in Guatemala to work construction, she experienced many cultural differences during the two weeks she was there. The poverty level is one factor that Laura commented on. "You see little children on the streets trying to bum money off of you or trying to sell you something. They will just beg and beg until you give in. Even though you don't know their language, you can feel how desperate they are for anything. I think that if I would have stayed down there much longer I would have had a total culture shock."

Although seeing the daily pain of the Guatemalan people, Laura also experienced some good feelings. "I was influenced the most by the appreciation the people show you. They are grateful for even the littlest thing."

"Because my brother and dad went before, I had heard all of the stories and seen all of the pictures, but you can't know what an experience like this is ever like until you experience it yourself."

Laura had found this trip to be a life changing experience, and felt that it would be the same for anyone else planning to attend this sort of trip.













Head Coach Hurd and Assistant Coach Chapman together agree that Coach Purigroski has taught them a lot about coaching football over the






Lady Vulcans Shine in 1995

put forth by the young Lady Vulcans should pay off in years to come.


















scholarship was that it sounded like a lot of fun. "I never thought I would make it to the semi-final round. I thought that it couldn't hurt to try," she explained.




Volleyball Team Digs Deep








Matt Terry Voted State Governor







Glistening Under the Stars



The Senior Alpha Beta award was given to Dustin Shannon. Also receiving special recognition was John Chomos and Steven


Maurer for their perfect attendance throughout their four years of high school.







One Accident That Didn't Turn Ugly



Vassar High School, as it stands today, has recently undergone renovation.

Courses of Study

Things have changed in Vassar's education policies over time. Many courses have been added as well as taken away.

In 1904, there were two main areas of study, language and general. It was required to take four years of a foreign language as well as Latin and English. The general classes consisted of English, mathematics, history, and science. Only two half-year classes were taught- commercial arithmetic and bookkeeping.

The first elective classes offered by the school were music and art, similar to today's offerings. Physical education was started as an elective class but is now a requirment for today's students.

Some examples of classes that the school offers now that they did not offer then are computers, foreign languages, and advanced placement. Classes offered then but not now include Latin, sewing, and agriculture.

Although elective courses have become more important these days than in the past, it is the academic program that still holds a very important role in education.


Interesting Facts

* In 1916, there were only 14 teachers employed.

* In 1861, Mildred Padman, who was the primary education teacher, earned \$3.50 a week. In that same year, the janitor, William Lee, Jr., earned \$6.00 a week.

* Back when the Commercial Department was offered, many of those who had taken commercial courses were immediately employed without further training.

* 1871 was the first year Vassar Schools offered a diploma.

Did you know-

On February 13, 1940, Vassar held a Father and Son Banquet in the Vassar High School Auditorium where 575 fathers and sons gathered to hear Judge Thomas Cotter of Detroit, Jo Jo White and Billy Rogell of the Detroit Tigers, and Judge Crampton of Caro explain the need for greater cooperation between fathers and sons.





The first graduating class of Vassar Schools had three members. They were:


* F.S. Lewis- became a physician and later was elected Postmaster of Port Angeles, Washington.

In time parades, sports, clubs and other organizations were added to interest the students in further learning. To this day the system still offers the students these special privileges. In a sense, they have become tradition to the students in Vassar Schools.

Vassar schools had a lot of clubs and organizations that would be astonishing to the people of the '90's to think had ever existed. Yet, they were proper for the time.

Just as sports were frowned upon in the earlier days of the school, so were these organizations. Many believed that the extra time the students had should be spent on studying instead of these activities. Eventually, it became known that these activities taught the students many social skills that academics alone couldn't have taught them. Among the organizations were: Intramural Athletics, Band, Boys' and Girls' Glee Club, Dramatics, Debate, Radio/Camera Club, and Girl Reserves.



A Look at the Past

In 1851, just two years after the town of Vassar was formed, Townsend North, the founder of the town, began to petition for a school system. That summer the "Curtis Shanty" which was located on South Main Street served as a school house.

Miss Augusta Slafter taught Vassar school that summer. She was paid \$1.50 a week, and she received free boarding from the parents of her pupils.

The following year a frame school house was built. The school system consisted of a total of three teachers, D.G Wilder, Charles Fonda, and A.J. Leach.

In 1860, a new school was built where the former Central School was torn down this year. This building was ruined by fire in 1917. The first principal of this brick building was Mr. Keyes. Although the school was inspected and graded in 1864, it did not grant diplomas until 1871.

A small school was built in 1869 on Maple Street. This building (known then as Townsend North) was made into a home later. Another school building was built on the east side of the river. This building was named McKinley in honor of President McKinley.

Things will continue to change throughout history, but the Vulcans will continue to hold their spirits high.

Vassar's 1921 graduating class was the first class to graduate from the newly built high school, which became the Central School. This class started in the new building because of the a fire that burned their previous school. The class was farmed out in church basements and halls for the year the new school was being built.




