The 2000 High Point Rider was Kelsey Guthrie. The team was undefeated in Western Showmanship.







Mike May Dedication







The plaques were purchased by the school and will hang in the halls of Vassar High in rememberance of May. That way, none of us will forget May and what he did for our country.













